This year, the school continued its mission by successfully graduating its second class of seniors! These 15 students are pursuing a diverse range of options for their futures, including in-state and out-of-state colleges, the military, and various trade schools. What is most important, however, is the Class of 2025's commitment to Christian fellowship and spiritual growth, and we are pleased to share that several members of this class are currently still involved in a church even after graduation - praise God!

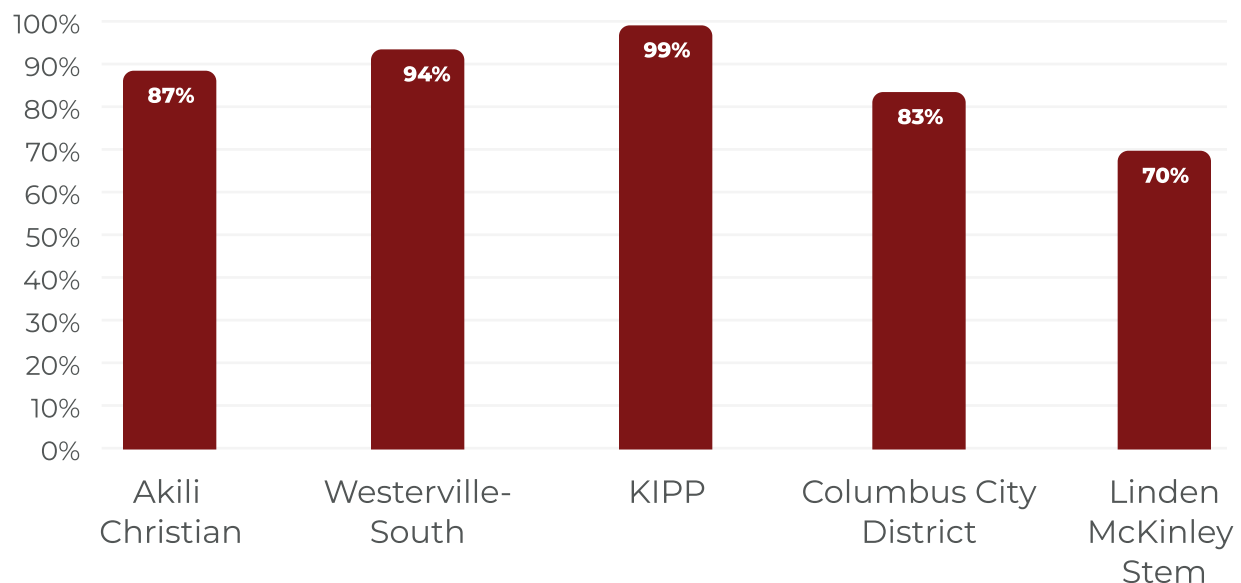

EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES

At Akili, we are committed to inspiring students to take full advantage of the academic opportunities available to them. Our strong graduation rates reflect the motivation and academic success of our students.

We are pleased to report that 13 of 15 seniors graduated in May 2025. The two remaining seniors from the Class of 2025 were able to complete their requirements and graduate in August, meaning that by August, 100% of the senior class graduated.

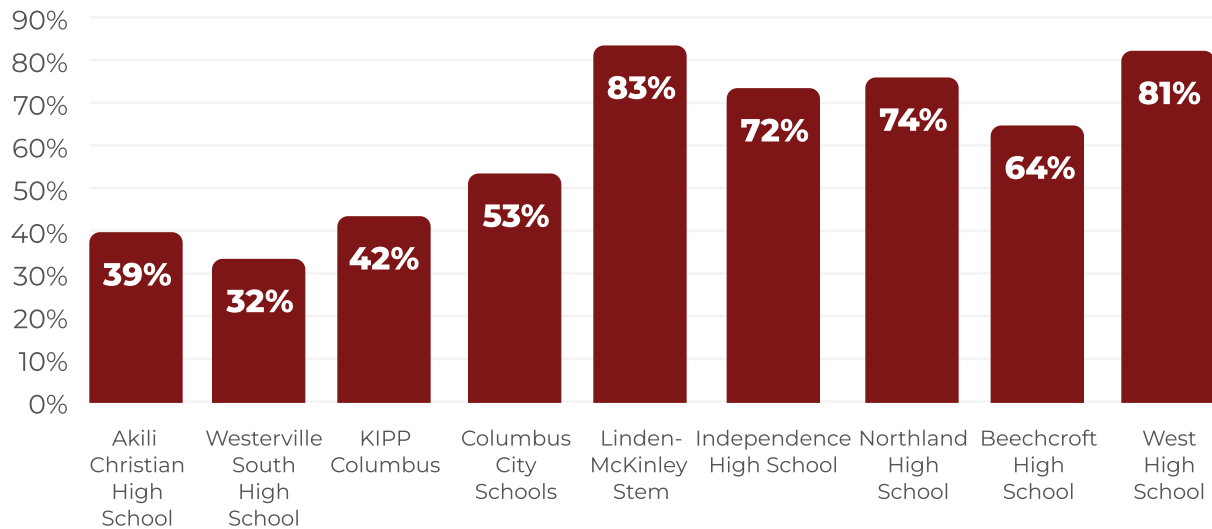

Low Student Absenteeism

Chronic Absenteeism Rates



For high school only district-wide chronic absenteeism rates, go to <https://reports.education.ohio.gov/report/report-card-data-district-attendance-rate-with-student-disagg>. District scores were derived from selecting the school district at the top of the web page and averaging the absenteeism rates for each grade level. Lower absentee rates show that students like coming to school.

According to Panorama Education, “Chronic absenteeism has profound and far-reaching consequences for students, extending well beyond missed school days. It can hinder the development of critical skills, reduce academic achievement, and create enduring challenges throughout a student’s life.”

Existing research indicates that students from lower socioeconomic backgrounds are disproportionately affected by chronic absenteeism. One study found that children from low-income households are nearly three times more likely to miss a significant number of school days. Compared to their counterparts in Columbus City Schools, Akili students are absent far less frequently. Although our students face the same challenges as those at public schools, Akili’s early intervention plans, individualized connections with families, and enjoyable, safe atmosphere have successfully decreased absenteeism.

LIFE COACHING

Students who make progress in their functional life skills are better prepared for a successful transition into responsible adulthood. To prepare students for their futures, Akili provides access to Life Coaches, adult volunteers who assist students with the skills needed to be successful as adults such as obtaining a driver's license, applying to jobs, and creating a budget.

IT TAKES MORE THAN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

At Akili Christian High School, we are deeply committed to preparing our students for success beyond high school by building strong partnerships with local businesses and professionals.

During the 2024–2025 school year, Akili students engaged in a variety of opportunities to explore potential career paths. Eight guest speakers from diverse professional fields visited the school to share their experiences and encourage students to consider a wide range of career options. In addition to these presentations, students attended the Job and Resource Fair at the Columbus Metropolitan Library, and upperclassmen had the opportunity to tour The Ohio State University and Columbus State Community College.

This year, we are proud to highlight our most significant collaborations with Nationwide Children's Hospital and Columbus State Community College for College Credit Plus (CCP). Six students participated in the College Credit Plus program, earning college credits while working to complete their high school degree. During the 2024-2025 school year, one of our students participated in a paid 8-week veterinary internship with Nationwide. This opportunity provided hands-on experience in a professional setting and was described by the student as a "great experience" that broadened her understanding of career pathways in veterinary medicine. This partnership continues to serve as a model for future student internships and career exposure.

“As Akili’s school counselor, I work with students to help them overcome barriers that are interfering with their success at school. Some of this work includes meeting with students individually to help equip them for whatever obstacles they are facing, coordinating with outside organizations to provide cohesive support for students facing mental health crises or other concerns, and providing referrals to resources for students and families in need.

As a proactive measure to improve school culture, we are running our second year of ROX, an evidence-based girls’ group aimed at building strong student leaders who are knowledgeable in navigating relational conflicts, creating healthy relationships, and promoting physical and online safety. I’m excited to work with this group of freshman and sophomore girls and hope this will lay a strong foundation for future leaders at Akili!”

Brittany Johnston, School Counselor: Brittany began working at Akili in January 2024. She earned her master’s degree in social work and previously worked as a school social worker at Columbus City Schools. Brittany also enjoys serving in Renegade, a ministry for inner city youth at Dwell Community Church.

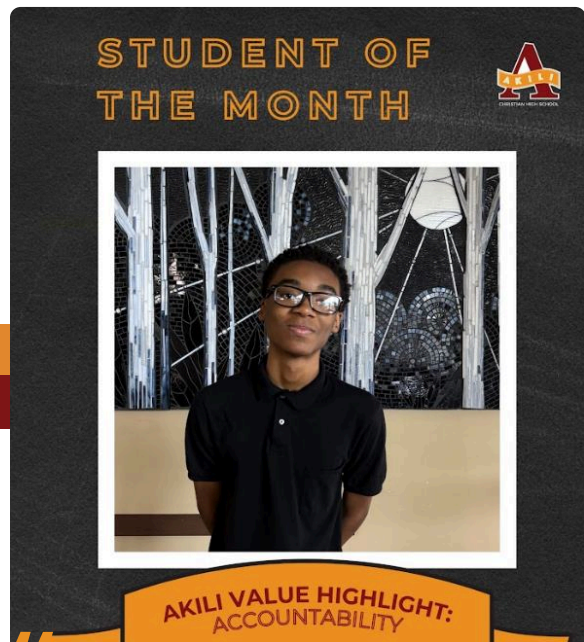

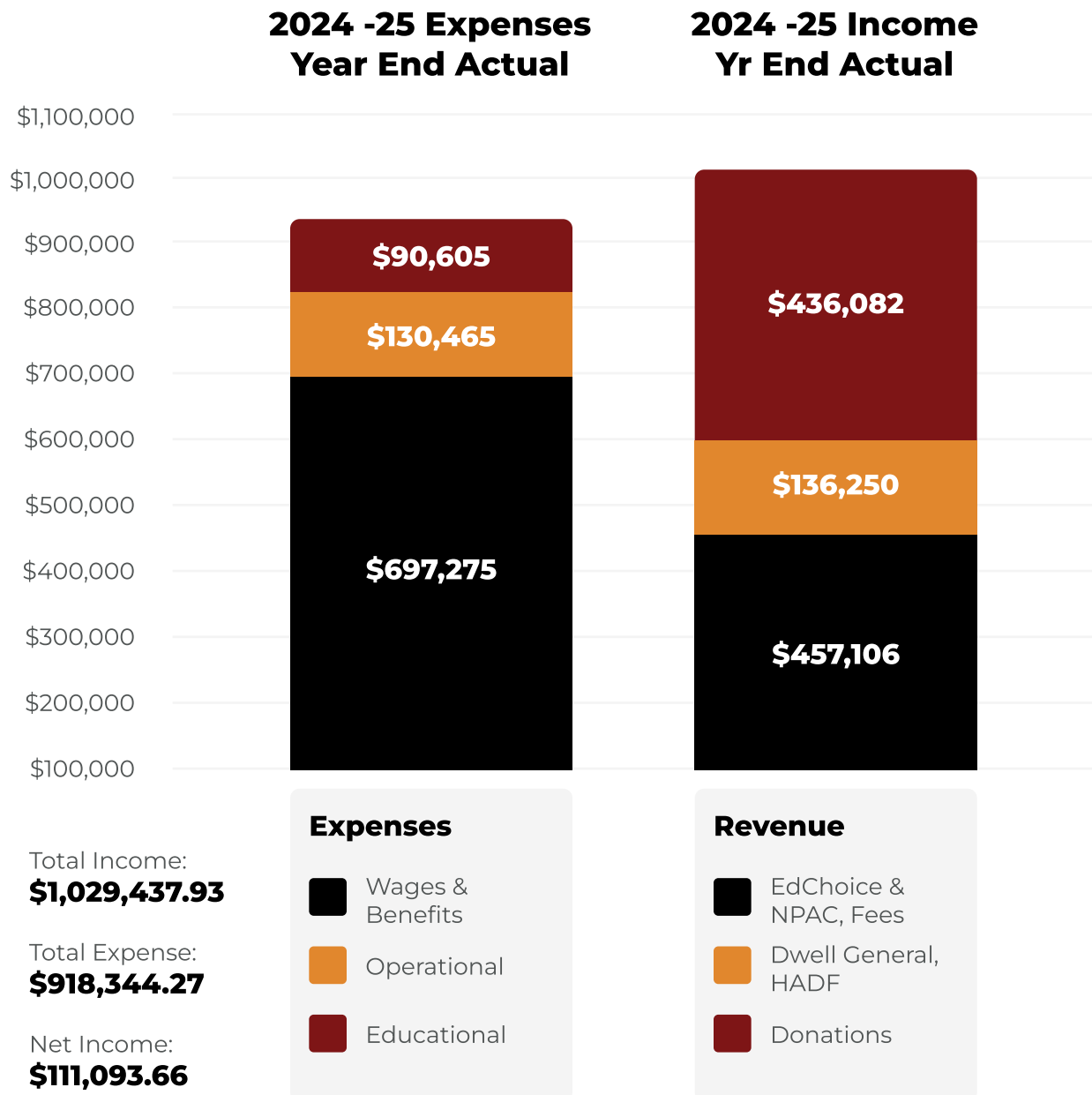
